




# RECYCLING IN 3-D

## Sculpture Contest



In conjunction with our Recycle.More.Often campaign, the Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works' Recycling Division is sponsoring the [Recycling in 3-D Sculpture Contest](#) for middle school students. We are seeking interested participants from your school.

The [Recycling in 3-D Sculpture Contest](#) challenges students to lend their creative talents to the noble cause of recycling. To participate, students will use recyclables from their homes to create a sculpture depicting a Chesapeake Bay scene, wildlife, or activity. Participants will be encouraged to use one to two weeks worth of recyclable materials to show the volume of recyclables produced by their households.

The Recycling Division is asking for your help to get the word out about this contest and in encouraging students to participate. Enclosed you will find the contest kit for contestants.

Students may participate as individuals or in teams of up to three students.

The contest kit contains Recycling Information, Official Rules, Helpful Hints, Application Form, and Prize Information for Winners. Prizes will be awarded for First, Second, and Third Place sculptures as well as Honorable Mention. Winning and Honorable Mention sculptures will be on display throughout the holiday season at the Heritage Office Complex in Anne Arundel County.



# RECYCLING IN 3-D



## *Sculpture Contest Official Rules*

### ENTRY RULES

1. This contest is sponsored by the Anne Arundel County Department of Public Works Recycling Division and open to all Anne Arundel County middle school students. The Recycling Division is looking for larger than life sculptures that show what you're recycling at home!
2. Individual students can enter the contest by faxing or emailing an official application form to the Recycling Division (fax: 410-222-4484, email: pwboog22@aacounty.org) by Friday, December 21st, 2018.
3. Contestants must deliver their sculptures to the Anne Arundel County Utility Operations Complex at 445 Maxwell Frye Road, Millersville, MD between 4:00 and 4:30 PM on Thursday, January 17th, 2019 for consideration.
4. The sculpture must contain ONLY items that are recyclable through Anne Arundel County's Curbside Recycling Program. Items must be clean and free from food or dirt. Glue, tape, string, wire, etc. may be used to hold the sculpture together securely.



### PLEASE, NO GLASS OR YARD WASTE FOR THIS CONTEST.

5. Sculptures should depict a Chesapeake Bay scene, wildlife, or activity. Examples include, fishing or sporting boats, crabbing, water skiing, waterfront living, crabs, fish, or birds. The sculpture should reflect what the student feels is most important about living near the water or the Chesapeake Bay's importance to Anne Arundel County.
6. The width and length of the sculpture are limited to 4 feet each. The height of the sculpture is not limited, however, the sculpture must be able to stand on its own without being attached to any other structure.
7. Only one entry per student/group.
8. Sculptures will be judged on originality, creativity, and percentage of recyclables used.

## *Sculpture Contest Official Rules*

### SELECTION PROCESS

A Selection Committee will review the submissions and select the winners at the official judging/ceremony. See Notification. All entries are subject to the Selection Committee's decision.

The Recycling Division is sponsoring this contest to solicit original and creative sculptures for the [Recycling in 3-D Sculpture Contest](#). The Recycling Division reserves the right to select, in its sole discretion and for any reason, winning sculptures from those submitted to The Recycling Division for this project.

The Recycling Division also reserves the right to reject, in its sole discretion, any sculpture that includes advertising except with respect to Anne Arundel County's recycling program, refers to companies or other entities, reflects social disrespect, contains inappropriate slogans and/or images, or is deemed unacceptable by The Recycling Division for any other reason.

### OWNERSHIP

Once a sculpture is chosen, the winner hereby assigns the copyright of it to The Recycling Division, which shall have the right to produce and distribute the sculpture and its images to all relevant media. No payment will be made to the winner for these rights. The finished sculptures will be property of The Recycling Division.

### NOTIFICATION

Winners will be announced at the [Recycling in 3-D Sculpture Contest](#) judging/ceremony on Thursday, January 17th, 2019 at the Anne Arundel County Utility Operations Complex. Judging will begin at 5:00 PM. Prizes will be awarded after the competition takes place, as we need to determine how to split up the prizes based on group-sizes. Parents and family members are encouraged to attend.

### PRIZES AND RECOGNITION

Visa ® Gift Cards will be awarded for First (\$300), Second (\$240), and Third Place (\$120) sculptures as well as Honorable Mention (\$60). Sculptures will be displayed Heritage Office Complex during the holiday season.

### Materials to Use:

Recyclable paper, plastic, and metal items. No glass please!

### Quantity of Material:

Each sculpture should use one to two weeks' worth of your household's gathering of the material(s) used so your sculpture can be "larger than life."

### Examples:

The examples on the left, are winners from the previous year to give you an idea. Your final sculptures can represent any winter holiday or activity you choose. Examples of holidays are Christmas, Hanukkah, Kwanzaa, or New Year. Activities could be sledding, skiing, or ice skating.

### Helpful Hints:


1. Contestants are encouraged to use a variety of recyclables FROM THEIR HOME instead of purchasing new items. One to two weeks of recyclable materials should be enough, but use more if needed. Use materials that have already served another purpose, like metal cans, mail or school paper.

2. While paint is not prohibited, students are STRONGLY encouraged to let the raw materials used to create the sculpture speak for themselves. Look for items that are already the color you wish to represent. If paint is necessary, use it sparingly. (See the example to the right of how artist Ellen Callaway used recycled materials of the same color to create this image.)



3. Your sculpture needs to be delivered to a public location, so make sure you can easily transport it.

4. Don't wait until the last minute to assemble your sculpture. Assembly onsite before the judging will be difficult. Putting the sculpture together ahead allows you time to work out any kinks, ensure the sculpture is stable and easy to transport. Remember, winning sculptures will be on display for a few weeks so you'll want it to be durable.
